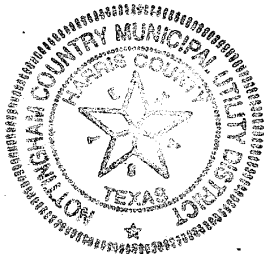
NOTTINGHAM COUNTRY MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT

The Board of Directors of Nottingham Country Municipal Utility District will hold a regular meeting on Monday, June 17, 2024, at 11:30 a.m., at the offices of Allen Boone Humphries Robinson LLP, 3200 Southwest Freeway, Suite 2600, Brazos Room, Houston, Texas, to discuss and, if appropriate, act upon the following items:

1. Comments from the public.
2. Approve minutes of prior meetings.
3. Director matters, including:
 - a. accept resignation of Director Moon and appoint new director;
 - b. approve Sworn Statement, Official Bond, and Oath of Office of new director;
 - c. reorganize the Board and authorize execution of District Registration Form;
 - d. Open Meetings Act and Public Information Act Training Requirements;
 - e. conflict of interest disclosure required under Chapter 176 of the Texas Local Government Code, including review of disclosure forms adopted by the Texas Ethics Commission and List of Local Government Officers; and
 - f. Cybersecurity training requirements.
4. West Harris County Regional Water Authority matters.
5. Financial and bookkeeping matters, including payment of the bills, review of investments, and amend budget.
6. Tax assessment and collection matters, including delinquent tax collections, installment agreements, payment of tax bills, and requests for waivers of penalties and interest.
7. Authorize delinquent tax attorney to proceed with collection of delinquent taxes.
8. Operation of District facilities, billings, meter maintenance program, and repairs and maintenance, including:
 - a. customer correspondence; and
 - b. update on system-wide leak detection inspection.
9. Hearing on termination of water and sewer service to delinquent customers and authorize termination of service.
10. Engineering matters and capital improvement projects, including authorize design, approve plans and specifications, authorize advertisement for bids, review bids and approve award of contract, approve pay estimates, time extensions and change orders, and final acceptance, as appropriate, for the following:
 - a. wastewater treatment plant improvements, including driveway improvements;
 - b. sanitary sewer rehabilitation program;

- c. District Capital Improvement Plan Budget update;

 - g. deeds, easements, consents to encroachment, requests for service, or utility commitment letters;
 - h. update on facility assessment to evaluate implementation of flood mitigation measures, repairs, and improvements at District facilities, including:
 - i. WWTP flood mitigation;
 - ii. Well No. 2 flood mitigation; and
 - iii. Well No. 3 flood mitigation; and
 - i. update on Harris County Precinct No. 4 roadway improvement project and associated Interlocal Agreement and arborist proposals.
11. Greenbelt Park and Greenbelt Norwalk operating, repair, and maintenance matters, including:
- a. landscape maintenance report;
 - b. proposals for additional work;
 - c. Park Use Agreements;
 - d. long-term park and recreational facility planning matters;
 - e. landscape architect's report; and
 - f. update on trails project and coordination with Harris County Precinct 4 as part of its Places 4 People: 2023 Call for Projects program, and authorize appropriate actions related thereto.

- a. report on Public Power Pool Technical Committee; and
 - b. update regarding Public Power Pool contract, if applicable.
13. Emergency notification system matters.
14. District technology and information management matters.
15. Discuss website matters.
16. Meeting planning matters.
