

## NOTICE OF MEETING

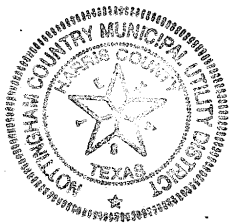
### NOTTINGHAM COUNTRY MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT

The Board of Directors of Nottingham Country Municipal Utility District will hold a regular meeting on Monday, September 16, 2024, at 11:30 a.m., at the offices of Allen Boone Humphries Robinson LLP, 3200 Southwest Freeway, **Suite 2400, Blanco Room**, Houston, Texas, to discuss and, if appropriate, act upon the following items:

1. Comments from the public.
2. Approve minutes of prior meetings.
3. West Harris County Regional Water Authority matters.
4. Engage auditor to conduct audit for fiscal year end September 30, 2024.
5. Financial and bookkeeping matters, including:
  - a. payment of the bills and review of investments;
  - b. conduct annual review of Investment Policy and adopt Resolution Regarding Annual Review of Investment Policy;
  - c. review, revise, and adopt Resolution Establishing the Authorized Depository Institutions and Adopting List of Qualified Broker/Dealers with Whom the District May Engage in Investment Transactions; and
  - d. adopt budget for fiscal year end September 30, 2025.
6. Tax assessment and collection matters, including delinquent tax collections, installment agreements, payment of tax bills, and requests for waivers of penalties and interest.
7. Discuss 2024 tax rate, set public hearing date, and authorize notice of public hearing regarding adoption of tax rate.
8. Operation of District facilities, billings, meter maintenance program, and repairs and maintenance, including:
  - a. customer correspondence; and
  - b. update on system-wide leak detection inspection.
9. Hearing on termination of water and sewer service to delinquent customers and authorize termination of service.
10. Engineering matters and capital improvement projects, including authorize design, approve plans and specifications, authorize advertisement for bids, review bids and approve award of contract, approve pay estimates, time extensions and change orders, and final acceptance, as appropriate, for the following:
  - a. wastewater treatment plant improvements, including driveway improvements;
  - b. sanitary sewer rehabilitation program;
  - c. District Capital Improvement Plan Budget update;
  - d. development of Geographic Information System;
  - e. proposals for rehabilitation of District facilities and engineering work, including water tank inspection;
  - f. development in the District;
  - g. deeds, easements, consents to encroachment, requests for service, or utility
